



minister of national defense on alt matters including or relating to the naval, military and air service of Canada, will be created with the coming into effect of the National Defense Act, Jan. 1st.

This act amalgamates the Departments of Militia, naval service and air board under the administration of Hon, G. P. Graham, who on that date takes the new title of minister of national defense.
