### Vessel Arrives From Barbadoes.

Was 10 Days in the Ice.  
 The schooner Annie L. Warren 27 days from Barbadoes, reached port today bringing a cargo of molasses to A. Goodridge & Sons. The vessel was 10 days in the ice on this coast, but for which she would have made a remarkably quick voyage. This is the vessel that was jammed in the ice about 10 miles off Cape Spear yesterday. The Fogatia was despatched to her but the captain of the Anne Warren would not avail of the steamer's services she not being in any grave danger.
