"Why Does Not God End the War!"

The usual Sabbath services were held in the Cochrane St. 'Centennial Church yesterday. The Rev. N. M. Guy, M.A., before taking up his text "For me to live is Christ," from which a timely and profitable exhortation was given, addressed the boys and girls present on what a chart stands for and how it marks off the rocks and shoals.
