CUBAN WARSHIP SERVES LIQUOR IN TORONTO.

TORONTO, Aug. 29.

Caesar Barrago Consul-General of Cuba, last night expressed indignation at the reference in the Toronto evening papers to the fact that champagne and liquor had been served to visitors on board the Cuban warship Patria, lying off the exhibition grounds here. He said the practice was customary on board foreign warships when in port and the papers in question had shown discourtesy to his country which had at great expense sent a warship 3,000 miles to show friendship for Canada. Mr. Hales, Chairman of the Ontario Liquor Board said he thought the Ontario Temperance Association could prevent liquor being brought into Ontario on a warship and the Consul declared if such action were taken he would order the warship home and consider the course an unfriendly act towards Cuba.

Fishery Protection Cruiser Arrives.

"ARRAS" REPORTS FRENCH BANKERS DOING WELL.

The Canadian Fishery Protection Cruiser Arras, arrived in port yesterday from the Banks for supplies. The Arras reports that the catch of the Lunenburg fleet is far behind that of last season. On the other hand the French fleet have done well and their total catch will be in the neighborhood of a half million quinquets. About 100 vessels comprise the fleet.

There were 40 Portuguese vessels operating as well as several Danish vessels, and like the French fleet, they have good trips.

Capt. Barkhouse reports fish plentiful at Cape St. Mary's and on St. Pierre Banks.

At Cape Pine the Arras spoke to two Grand Bank vessels, who were fishing in that section and they reported fish scarce, and operations handicapped by bad weather.

The Lunenburg fleet, comprising 78 vessels, are now in Newfoundland ports seeking fish.



THE THING HE LOVES.

"If there is anything in the world I hate," I heard a man say the other day, "it's the love of a woman."

Of course "each" is a tremendous poetical exaggeration. Some men don't succeed in killing the thing they love because it stands up against them and is too strong to be killed. And there are others who don't try. But the in-

stinct is one of those deep, buried, incompressible, powerful human instincts that fight in us against our happiness.

A man love the ray irresponsibility in his bride, he kills it with the responsibilities he has laid upon her and then wonders where her charm has gone.

He loves her coolness and inaccessibility, he kills it with his demands and then misses the nymph he has exercised and wonders where and why she went.

He loves her vivacity and her coquetry and he kills it by his lack of response after marriage.

He loves her popularity with other men and kills it with his jealousy.

Doubtless women do the same sort of thing in the marriage where the female is the stronger and more positive personality. But until economic conditions shall change even more than they have already, these will be in the minority.
