FINANCIAL BENEFIT OF PAPA-RUS-KEY RACE.

NEW YORK, Oct. 26.—Financial statements following the check-up after the \$100,000 match race between Zev and Papyrus last Saturday show a profit of \$22,206.25, according to the statement of the Westchester Racing Association.

The total receipts, minus the war tax, were \$230,032.25 and the disbursements were \$207,826.10.

The profit from the race will be added to the surplus fund racing during the past season, making a fund of \$71,000 and it will be spent in improving Belmont Park.

DAVE MAGILL BEATS PENWILL.

In a 15-round contest at Doncaster Guardsman Penwill (Pence) snarled an otherwise splendid display against Dave Magill the "cruiser" and heavyweight champion of Ireland, by carelessness in the delivery of several right crosses. The culminating point came in the 12th round, when the ex-Army champion hit Magill low with a long right and the Irishman went down in pain, the referee thereupon disqualifying Penwill. Magill was examined in his room by the doctor, who stated that the Irishman had obviously been fouled, but that he was "all right." Penwill showed himself in a much better light than he did in his fight with Gipsy Daniels at Olympia.

It was much more forceful, the features of his display being his accurate delivery of the left hand, which he used as a "prop" whilst he lashed in right hooks to the body. Many of these latter blows fell on Magill's left arm, but he was always ready in thrilling attacks after Magill had planted his well-known left-hand "lead" on the soldier's face. Magill was shorter in reach than Beckett, sparring partner, but, being much lighter, was also the quicker. Magill is the ex-cross-country four miles champion of his country.

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pitcher was taking no chance with Babe. He was keeping them outside and they strayed a little over the line. A pitcher must have perfect control and can't always put the ball exactly where he wants to. It's never safe to grove the ball for Babe and you can't always hook the corners when you want to, particularly when you are in the hole. Babe used to hit at all those things once. Now he waits and takes his base.

I don't mean to say that Babe is never passed deliberately. On the contrary this happens more often in his case than with any other batter. I don't usually pass him deliberately myself, but I do sometimes. There are times when it would be foolish to do anything else. But Babe sometimes interferes with your plans even when you are trying to pass him. I well remember an incident which happened two seasons ago. It was the best kind of good policy to pass Babe and I was trying to do that very thing. I shot a ball over way wide of the plate, at least a foot outside. But Babe was in hitting mood that day so he reached over, caught that ball with his long, heavy bat and drove it into the centerfield bleachers for the longest hit ever made on the ball field.

Babe isn't hitting as many home runs this season as he has done before. But he's a much better ball player than he ever was before and he's a better hitter.

That's because he isn't staking everything on his home run record. He hits singles and doubles now. Sometimes he even bunts. And if you are feeding him bad balls he waits you out. He'll take his base and when he is on first he's by no means a bad base-runner for he's tricky and takes chances.

There are a lot of good hitters in baseball. There are even a lot of sluggers these days and many of them home run specialists. But there is only one Babe Ruth.
