It is made of strong, urable material, and it is claimed hat, even if cut or filled with water, it etains the buoyancy, which consists ot of air but of a special composition f Kapok silk floss, impervious to watand possessing more than five times the buoyancy of cork. It weighs only about 17 lbs., and, folded up, is asily carried. In the suit is a pocket inveniently fitted to carry food and


