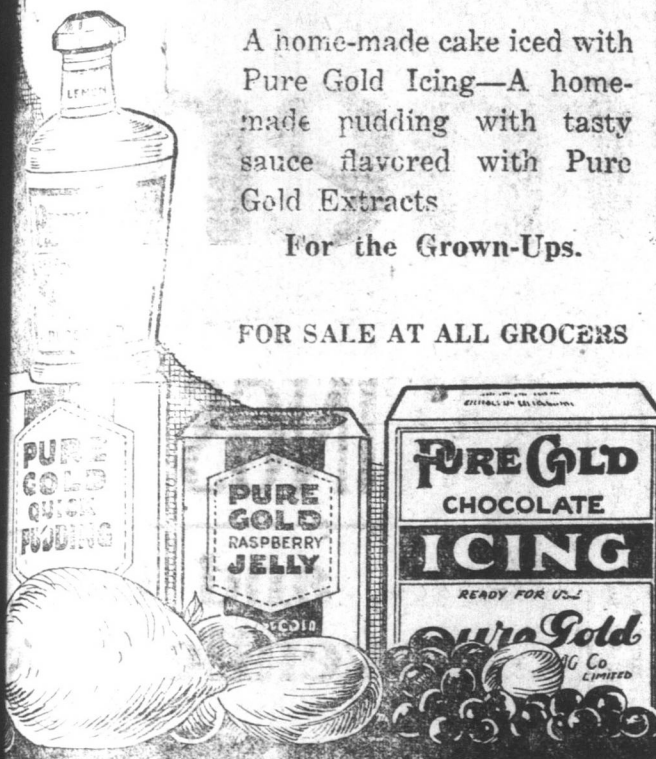

NEWFOUNDLAND'S REAL STATUS.

To the Editor of The Herald:

In several otherwise admirable news items recently published in The Herald relative to the brief visit to this city of the Newfoundland delegation on its way to the inter-parliamentary conference at Washington, reference is repeatedly made to Newfoundland as "the province." Newfoundland is not a province either of the Dominion of Canada or of any other political entity. It is one of the separate, self-governing dominions comprised within the British Empire, and for many years has enjoyed responsible government under a Governor appointed by the crown, an upper house termed the Legislative Council, and a lower house called the House of Assembly.

The British North America act, under which the Dominion of Canada was formed, contained a permissive provision for the entry of Newfoundland into the Canadian confederation, but Britain's oldest colony has steadfastly and, as most of her well-wishers believe, wisely retained her separate status.—Boston Herald.

ALFRED NOBLE.

There passed quietly into rest in the closing hours of Saturday last, after but seven days' illness, Alfred Noble, having passed the allotted span, attaining almost seventy-eight years of age. The late Alfred Noble was born in Nipper's Harbour, Green Bay, December 9th, 1847. There the greater part of his life was spent. During his younger days he followed the fisheries and coopership business, later becoming Government wharfinger at Nipper's Hr., a position which he held for about eighteen years, thus becoming widely and popularly known. Upon the demise of his wife about seven years ago he retired from work, coming to St. John's, where he has since resided with his only daughter, Mrs. S. G. Malmgren. He is the last of a large family of sons and daughters of the late William Noble. Deceased was of a quiet, gentle, unassuming manner and loved by all that knew him.

Will Demonstrate Life Saving Suit on Tuesday

Capt. G. D. Kelly who gave a demonstration of a new life saving suit at the King's wharf on Friday last will again on Tuesday at 4 p.m. demonstrate how easy it is for the wearer of the suit to keep afloat. This demonstration will take place at the King's wharf.

The new life saving suit is manufactured in Canada by the National Life Preserver Co., Ltd. of England and Canada. The suit is made with shoes and mittens, all in one piece, completely enclosing the body in a warm watertight, and highly-buoyant covering. It is worn over all the clothing and shoes, and can be put on, closed watertight, and locked securely in a few seconds. It is made of strong, durable material, and it is claimed that, even if cut or filled with water, it retains the buoyancy, which consists not of air but of a special composition of Kapok silk floss, impervious to water and possessing more than five times the buoyancy of cork. It weighs only about 17 lbs., and, folded up, is easily carried. In the suit is a pocket conveniently fitted to carry food and drinking water.

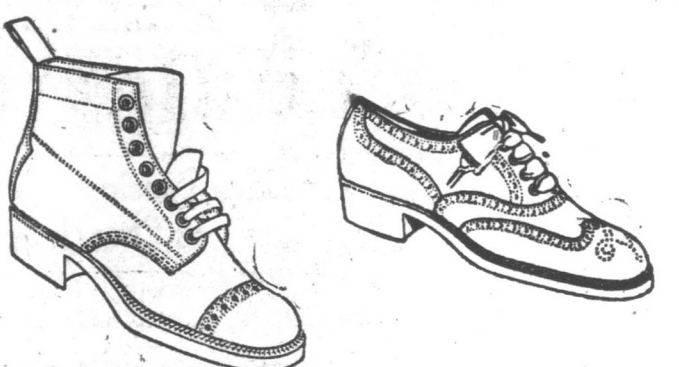
