BASEBALL.
Toronto's baseball club was done up in good style at Tecumseh Park yesterday, the reason being that the great south-paw twirler, Titcomb, knew not how to twirl, and his support was rather low. He only pitched four innings, but in that time managed to give five bases on balls, one by hitting the batter, and six clean hits. Twelve men reaching first in four innings proved the pitcher's lack of effectiveness through worked hard after the visitors had made three singles off him, in the second and only two solitary instances of stick-work were recorded by the Queen City representatives during the remainder of the game. Five of the visiting nine fanned the air and not a single man secured a base on balls. Mickey was beyond doubt the right man in the right place on this occasion.

For London's runs the work of Titcomb was mainly responsible, although errors by Wood in the ninth and by Ike and McLaughlin in the third were helpful in that direction.

THE TURF.
THE LONDON TURF CLUB'S CLOSING DAY.
The second day of the London Turf Club's June meeting has come and gone and all that remains of the minds of the participants and the interested audience that witnessed the several events. The events were all well contested for second if not first place, and proved interesting if not keenly exciting in every instance.

The result of the 240 trot was a surprise to the sporting fraternity, Dynamite (who was again run under protest as a "ringer") being looked upon as the winner, while J. M. G., on account of the poor showing he made while exercising, was not viewed as a likely horse. For the first four heats J. M. G. was kept in the rear, while on account of some peculiarity which the driver admitted before the first heat was run, when he requested the judge to allow starts to be made even though he should be in the rear. It took seven heats to decide this race, the big grey winning after Dynamite had secured two heats and Byron Cole and Hiram one each.

With the majority of the spectators the running race and steeplechase were the most enjoyable events, and elicited more applause than the others combined. Days between the heats, the character of the previous day, detracted somewhat from the pleasure of the audience yesterday and caused much murmuring from the grand stand and bleachers.
