The Strathrey Knitting Company's Mills May be Rebuilt in Hamilton—Sud-den Death of a Well-Known Horseman.

Hamilton, Ont., Aug. 3.—It is possible that the Strathroy Knitting Company's mills, which were burned to the ground yesterday in Strathroy, will be rebuilt here. James Watson, of this city, is president of the company, and holds a big portion of the stock. The mills were mortgaged heavily, the creditors being the Bank of Montreal and Long & Bisby, of this city. If the mills are completely destroyed the loss will be \$130,000, against an insurance of \$65,000.

THE HUSBAND OF SEVEN WIVES.

A Bigamist, Hotel Beat and Masonie Fraud Captured in Chicago.

Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Rulison and Detective Ryan left for Chicago last evening for the purpose of bringing B. F. Conrad here for trial. The charge is bigamy. Wife No. 3 is a sister of County Recorder Hobson. It is said, but perhaps with exaggeration, that there have been seven wives in all. Wife No. 3 fet the deception which was practiced on her keenly. She has located Conrad at one time and another in nearly all the important cities west of the Mississippi. While he was in Seattle she succeeded in having him arrested.

The officers there telegraphed for instructions as to whether they should hold him. Mr. Schwartz was in favor of replying in the affirmative and of sending an officer out there after the man, but the county commissioners hesitated on account of the expense of about \$700 which would be involved in bringing him here, without reference to his trial. For that reason nothing was done.

Chief Deitsch has sent circular letters all over the country, giving Conrad's photograph and description; also stating that he was formerly a member of the G. A. A. and Masonic orders, both of which organizations now no longer recognize him. Yesterday word was received that Conrad was under arrest in Chicago. Application for requisition papers was made at once, and last night the representatives of Prosecuting Attorney Schwartz left as stated.

Conrad is not only a rank bigamist, but a dead beat. His game is to stop at the best hotels, run a good bill and jump it. The dispatch received yesterday from Chicago stated that Conrad's baggage was held in the Leland House on account of an unpaid bill. He may resist being brought here, but the fight will not be long, and the prospects are excellent for his being speedily "railroaded" for a good long term at Columbus.

RELICS OF ST. JAMES.

San Francisco, Cal., Aug. 3.—The new Church of St. James, at the coiner of Guerrero and Twenty-third streets, claims to have secured not only a portion of an object which was in close contact to the Apostle St. James, but also a small lock of his hair. Recently the relies were exposed to view at the church, the occasion being the feast of St. James. Especially elaborate services were held, attended by large congregations, and the shrine was visited by hundreds of people during the day.

A little altar, especially arranged for this purpose, was stationed just within the railing at the left side of the sanctuary and thereon the golden reliquary reposed. The case was all that could be seen from the

The case was all that could be seen from the railing and the inscription in Latin could not be distinguished. Close inspection revealed two very small dark objects within the glass of the reliquary. One of these was said to be a bit of cloth from a garment worn by St. James and the other a minute lock of the apostle's hair.

Father Lynch, the pastor, declared that the relies had been obtained by him from the church authorities at Rome, that they were fully authenticated and that there could be no doubt of their genuineness. He had not made extended inquiries about them, for ne had not felt that there was any reason to do so.

No marvelous results in the line of miracles are expected through the agency of St. James, and this exhibition is not regarded as beyond the ordinary of such events in the Catholic Church.

The relics will be kept at the church, and each year at the feast of the patron saint they will be placed on the altar for the veneration of the believers.
