NEW YORK HONORS BANTING AND BEST

Discoverers of Insulin Tendered Banquet by the Sulgrave Institute.

New York, April 9.—In honor of Dr. Frederick G. Banting, discoverer of insulin, Dr. Charles Best, his associate, and the Canadian people, a dinner was given here tonight by the Sulgrave Institute.

A strong international flavor was lent the gathering by the attendance of Major-General Robert Lee Bullard, representing the United States army; Rodman Wanamaker, noted philanthropist and captain of industry; Dr. Forbes Godfrey, minister of health for the province of Ontario; T. A. Russell, of the board of governors of Toronto University; Leslie Sutherland, president of the Canadian Club, New York; Dwight A. Walker, president of the University of Toronto Club, New York; a large number of other prominent Canadians and members of the Canadian colony in New York, together with representatives of the British embassy at Washington.

DEATH SENTENCE FACED BY 391 SINCE YEAR 1900

Total of 104 Have Been Executed in Ontario in 24 Years.

TRIPLE HANGINGS

Two Met Penalty at St. Thomas For the Slaying of Youth.

Since 1900 death sentences have been executed in Canada on 391 persons. Of these 104 were executed in Ontario.

Triple or double hangings have been rare occurrences in the history of Canadian crime. From available records there have not been more than a dozen or so such cases, among them the following:

Hangman Ellis officiated at a triple hanging when three bandits, Victor Carmel, Jean Baptiste St. Germain and Joe Gervais, were executed for slaying a sheriff's officer in Prince Albert, Sask., on Oct. 17, 1919. The trio stood on a single trap and

12 Sentences Of Death Given In Middlesex

Twelve sentences of death have been passed in Middlesex County during the last half century or more. Of these nine sentences were executed, and three have been altered to life imprisonment. Only one woman is among the twelve.

The list is as follows:

Thomas Jones, hanged in public on Dec. 15, 1868.

Cyrus Pritchard, hanged in public, on Dec. 18, 1871.

Phoebe Campbell, hanged June 20, 1872.

Benjamin Simmons, hanged Nov. 25, 1885.

Henry Smith, hanged June 14, 1890.

Marion ("Peg-Leg") Brown, hanged May 17, 1899.

William Moir, soldier, sentenced to death, and subsequently sent to Hamilton Asylum for Insane.

Thomas Hartwick, hanged April, 1909.

Mike Tancrede, sentenced to death, and subsequently given term of life imprisonment.

Sidney Murrell, hanged April 10, 1924.

Henry Jack Williams, sentenced to death, and subsequently given term of life imprisonment.

all died in the same instant.

In November, 1918, James McKay, sheriff's officer, went to Steep Creek to seize, under a court order, a team of horses belonging to a Dr. Gervais.

He was shot to death in a most brutal manner by Carmel and St. Germain. The pair hid in a dugout along the Saskatchewan River, and the police had to call in the local C. E. F. Battalion, a corporal being shot before the murderers were captured.

Triple Hanging in Montreal.

Another triple hanging, at which Arthur Ellis also officiated, took place in Montreal, when Baptiste Lemay, Murdoch Allan and Romeo Leconte paid the death penalty for slaying Alcide Payette, a farmer, on Jan. 23, 1920. The three, after stealing a motor car in which they were making a trip to Quebec, broke into Payette's farmhouse at St. Sulpice.

Payette, who was sleeping, awoke to find an electric torch shining in his face and a voice demanding his money or his life. He leaped out of bed and was instantly killed.

Lemay and Leconte were executed together standing on the same trap. Then Allan was hung after the bodies of the other two had been removed. The latter had no knowledge that the other two had died, for the procession to the gallows was by a route from which no sound went to the condemned man's cell.

Double Case in St. Thomas.

On June 13, 1895, Will Welter and John Hendershot were hanged at St. Thomas in the court yard of the Elgin County jail for the murder of the latter's nephew, William Hendershot, a boy of 18 years of age, in the Wardle woods at Middlemarch the fall before.

Hendershot and Welter had conceived a plan to get rich quickly by insuring the life of the lad for \$11,000, and then sought for some way to do away with him. One attempt at least was made in the barn on the Hendershot property, where the boy worked, when a large beam was dropped from a height of 20 feet upon him by a miracle. Later while sawing wood in the fall of the year he was murdered with a blow on the head with an axe in the hands of one of the men.

It was given out that a tree had fallen on him and the body prepared for burial. On the day before the funeral an inquest was ordered, and the impressions on the skull were found to correspond with the back of an axe.

A search in the woods where the murder had occurred the axe was discovered in the loose bark of a fallen tree. An examination of the skull showed it to have been the fatal instrument.

Chief Justice Meredith sentenced the men, who according to reports never made a confession. C. B. Osler prosecuted for the crown, and Norman MacDonald defended the men. John Murray, chief of detectives from Toronto, worked on the case for some time.

Two Women Hanged.

Two women have figured in double executions.

The first was Cordelia Viau, who was executed with her paramour, Sam Parslow, at St. Scholastique, Que., for slaying the former's husband, Cordelia, according to her own confession, had urged Parslow to do the deed in her home one Sunday afternoon after getting the victim drunk. When Parslow weakened after stabbing the victim several times the woman finished the deed herself. The man and woman were hanged side by side on a gray horse blanket suspended from the top of the gallows tree separating them, but long before that time their love had turned to hate.

A bootlegging tragedy was responsible for the execution of Mrs. Florence Lassandra, who was hanged on the same day as Emilio Piccirilli, at Port Saskatchewan, Alta., on May 3 last, for the slaying of Provincial Constable Steve Lawson. The two were hanged separately, the man going to his doom first, to be followed a few minutes after the body was removed by his accomplice.

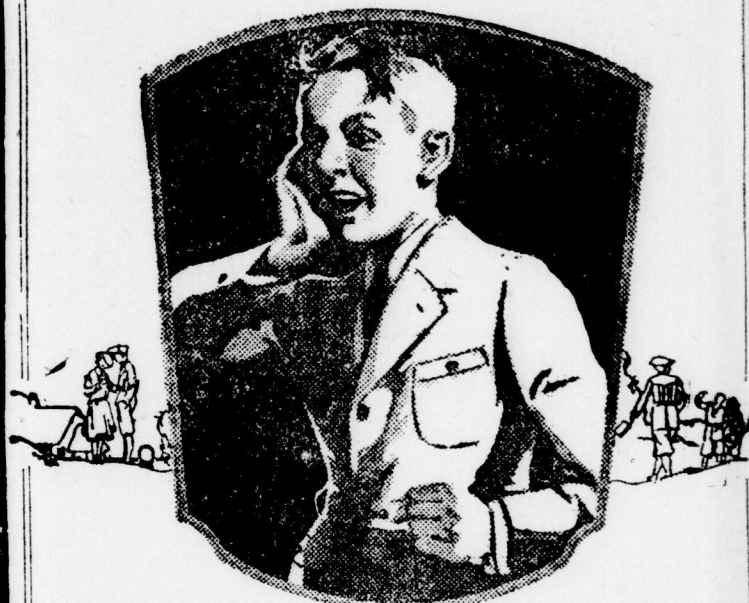
McFadden and Hotrum.

Toronto was the scene of a double hanging, when William McFadden and Roy Hotrum were executed together on Aug. 3, 1921, for the murder of Leonard, a druggist, when the pair tried to hold up his store. His assailants escaped in a motor car, standing near by. Another attempt at robbery the next week led to their arrest.

The two were placed on the trap together, facing opposite direction, about three feet apart. The minister of justice, in refusing their appeal for clemency, explained that while only one fired the fatal shot, both were equally guilty in the eyes of the law.

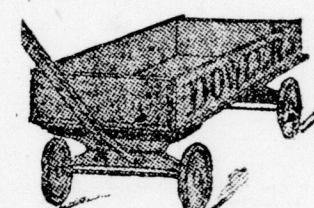

The last double hanging in Canada was the execution on Feb. 1 of two Eskimos, Ahik Omisk and "Esquimo" Tetamanga, on Herschel Island, for the murder of Corporal Doak, of the R. C. M. P., and Otto Binder, a fur trader. The execution aroused a storm of protest, including a declaration by Dr. Grenfell, the Labrador missionary, that it was a shame to hang such primitive people, whose understanding of right and wrong could only be compared to that of children.

Other Double Hangings.

On May 16, 1914, Frank Davis and Herman Clark were hanged at New Westminster, B. C., for the murder of Constable Archibald of Vancouver.

R. C. Each man consistently blamed the other right up to the time of the execution, which was carried out by Arthur Ellis.
