75 Parties Are Represented in 23 Factions on Official Ballot.

Associated Press Despatch. Berlin May 3.—The German na ionalists at their campaign for the election tomorrow making a determined eleventh hour attack on the Socialists for precipi-tating the revolution of November 1918. They threaten parliamentary investigation and punishment of the traitors" whom they charge with "stabbing the army in the back" inciting the naval mutiny at Kiel and staging the revolution throughout Germany with the aid of Russian rubles. A score of old army leaders, among them General Von Hutier and General Von Kosch, are broadcasting an appeal to their former comrades urging them to work for the nationalist ticket which de-mands renunciation of the Treaty of Versailles as well as other "humili ating and degrading demands from our former foes."
