



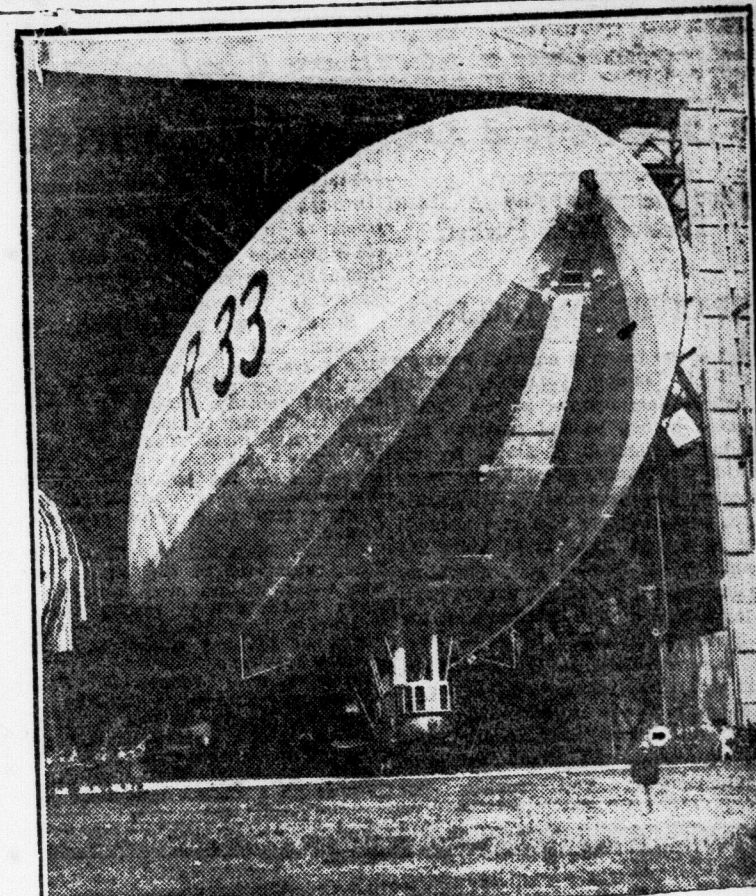

With a reconstructed nose, the R-33, English super-aircraft, takes to wing again for the first flight since her recent runaway.



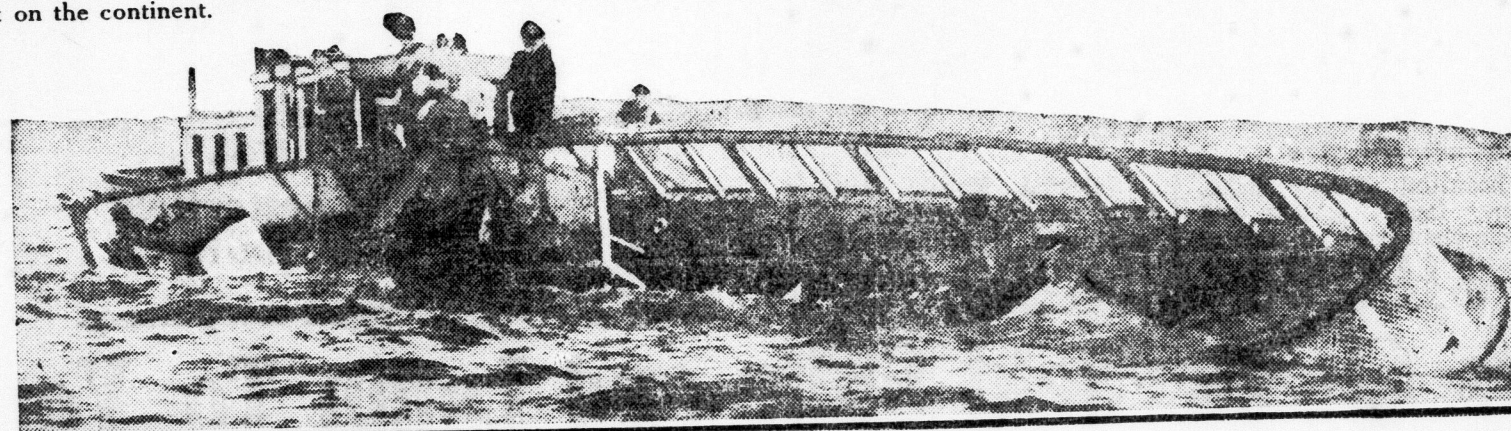
Giant "still" camera, said to be the largest ever built, exhibited at the Berlin photographic exposition.



Mme. Canope Chutisse, 70-year-old Greek danseuse, with her company of her own children. They have come to America after making a hit on the continent.



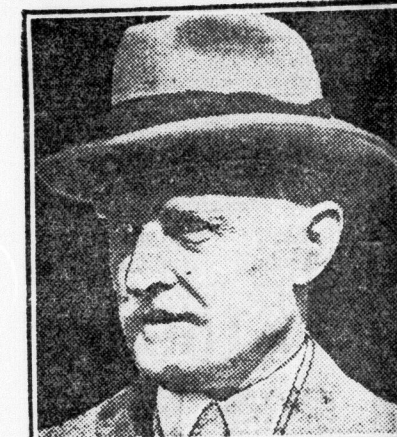
Constance, 18 months, only child of Mr. and Mrs. W. N. Bearss, 555 Grace street, Woodstock.

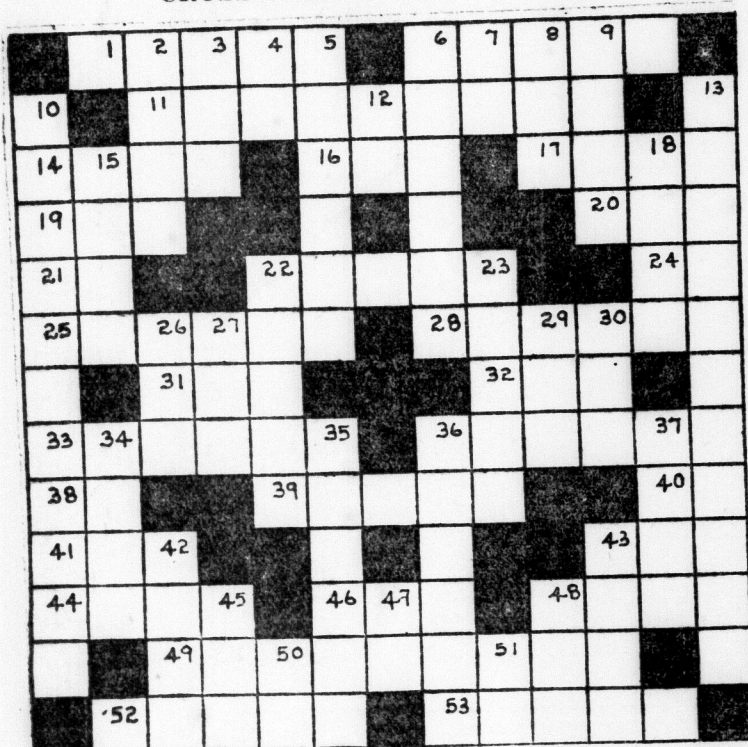


Mrs. John Drinkwater, wife of the noted English author, leaves for America, where she is to go on the concert stage.



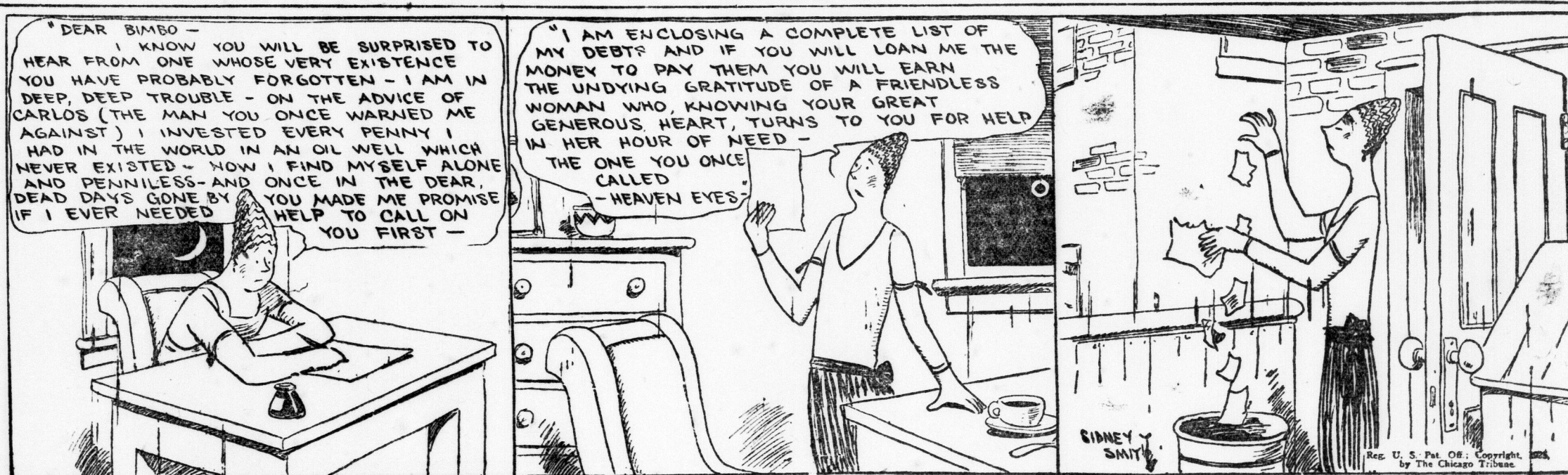
