Recognizing the necessity of stationing commercial commissioners in the various centres of trade in the East and the west the Japanese government introduced a bill providing for their expenditure in the last session of the Diet but the latter refused to give approval to the proposal. The government, however, it is said, is thoroughly convinced of the necessity of the proposal for the expansion of commerce as the periodical reports of the consuls are deemed insufficient to meet all the requirements. A similar bill that failed to materialize last session will again be introduced in the session will again be introduced in the next session of the Diet. The expenditure to be asked for will not at first exceed Y.30,000. To begin with, the commissioners are to be stationed at London, New York, Boston, Shanghal, and Tien Tsin. The death is announced at Pekin on the 5th ult., after a long illness, of Marquis Li, the eldest son and heir of the late first Marquis Li Hungchang, at the age of 40. He died of diphtheria and leaves a son, aged 21, to inherit the title and vast wealth left by the first Marquis. Before inheriting the title the last Marquis Li was known as Li Ching-she.
