Probably we shall export all the wheat. rye, corn and and oats that ocean tonnage can be found to carry, but after taxing this to the utmost and exporting vastly more of each than in any previous year it is impossible to get rid of the large surplus which our grain crops have left on our hands. Oats have been steady but inactive, the excellent shipping demand continuing. Provisions have been lifeless and without practicable features. The continued large receipts of hogs do not depress product as much as expected, but the bears are confidently expecting a sort of land-silde after a time and most of them are doubless fixed for it whether it comes or net.
