is true, but a comparison with similar returns ten years back, and before the stamp law came in force, will exhibit somewhat similar results, viz.: \$16,748, as compared to \$2,500, (oneseventh nearly) in the year 1857. Thus-

The statement of the Fee Fund account shows for the whole of Upper Canada a deficit after payment of the salaries of thirty-two

County Judges and five Recorders, and \$6,400 towards travelling expenses of the County Judges of \$47,833 21; and this is the whole deficit, for, as we have already observed, there is nothing left to be paid clerks or other officers. But in other years the fee fund has given a surplus to the general revenue fund. In the year we have already referred to, 1857. there was a surplus of \$24,797, contributed by the litigants in the Local Courts (after paying the whole establishment of these courts), to the general revenue of the Province.

So much just now as to law stamps.
