appreciable improvement has been made, both in the produce obtained and the cost of its production during the past year, and that this improvement is continuing, and will, it may be reasonably expected, still further improve during the current year. This improvement has been greatly due to the step which we took at the recommendation of our secretary in sending his chief clerk (Mr. Simmons) down to the works, in order that he might watch the financial result of each separate process, and report upon the same to the London office. Mr. Nicholls, who was previously our assistant resident manager, and who, since Dr. Haege's resignation, has been placed in chief charge of the smelting operations, has also greatly aided in obtaining this satisfactory result. On the whole, therefore, notwithstanding the terribly low price of copper which we have to contend with, and which I hope may, before long, somewhat improve, I thick I may congratulate you on the results of the operations of the past year.






