No. 12. St. George's, (Toronto).	<i>R. A. Harrison, Q.C. Ogle R. Cowan. C. Mayrath.</i>	The following words are written at the foot of the certificate of election:— "N. B.—A protest having been entered in against the election of the above gentlemen, I have noted such protest on their certificate." "T. B. F."	Had the Incumbent withheld his certificate of election subject to protest, and given any particulars of the same, even the protestors' names, we might have considered any weight to be attached to it, should the parties protesting have attended or could have been cited to be heard. As it is we have a certificate of election formal and regular in every respect sent in, duly accompanied by the fees, behind which we do not feel ourselves called to go to consider a note of so vague a character as that set out in the third column.
No. 13. Oshawa.	<i>G. H. Grierson. F. W. Glen. John Cowan.</i>	That the certificate is irregular and insufficient.	The certificate objected to was a temporary one given by the churchwarden in the absence of the Incumbent. The regular formal certificate of the Incumbent being supplied the objection ceases and the seats are allowed.
No. 14. Port Whitby.	<i>John Woodhouse.</i>	In this case there is no entry on the printed list, and owing this the objection is brought before the Court by the Rev. C. R. Bell and Mr. Woodhouse, as also has All Saints' church, that this church is not represented.	We cannot see our way to an entry on this seat. The Mission of Brooklin and Columbus, of which Mr. Bell has charge, has duly returned three delegates, as also has All Saints' church, Whitby, of which Mr. Cole is Incumbent. There appears to be no regular clergyman for this church at Port Whitby, in earlier days the old parish church, and still being in the parish of Whitby, and Mr. Bell has recently, with the concurrence of the Incumbent of Whitby, kindly held occasional service there, as Dr. Heaven and others have done, but without claiming to send a delegate. Under these circumstances, and each Mission or Cure being limited to three delegates, and both All Saints', Whitby, and Brooklin and Columbus having full representation, we see no way to allowing a delegate from Port Whitby. If the claim be allowed to the church as within the parish of Whitby it can only be done by disallowing one of the delegates of All Saints', and on the certificate of the incumbent of Whitby as of an election within his Cure, whereas the election claimed for Mr. Woodhouse was held by the Missionary of a different Mission, and whose Mission has full representation. We refer to the cases of Wellington Square, Garden River, and Barrie, Nos. 5, 6, and 7, of 1871, but in all which the question had reference to elections held within the Missions and under the incumbent of the same.
