

BIOGRAPHICAL REGISTER OF OFFICERS ("The Stud Book")

This departmental publication consists of five volumes containing the personnel data and photographs of all officers serving abroad and in Canada, either at headquarters or on secondment to other government departments or to the private sector. Usually, one copy of each volume is kept in each Branch. Note that the Register is updated on an irregular basis.

LESTER B. PEARSON BUILDING FACILITIES

The building is named after Lester B. Pearson, who as the Under-Secretary of State for External Affairs during the post-war years, and later as Secretary of State for External Affairs and as Prime Minister, greatly increased the extent and significance of Canada's role in international affairs. For his part in solving the Suez Crisis in 1956, he received the Nobel Peace Prize. The following is a brief description of some of the building's facilities:

Banking

The Royal Bank of Canada maintains a full-service branch in the building located next to the Crush Lobby on the main floor. This branch is open to the public and follows normal banking hours. Call 564-2005 for general information. There is also a CS CO-OP automatic teller located on the main floor near to the entrance of Tower D.

Cafeteria

Located on the main floor next to Tower C. Open to the public and provides full meal service from 7:30 to 15:30.

Health Unit / First Aid (996-9227)

A health unit station is located just outside the cafeteria opposite the entrance to Tower C. There is a nurse on duty during normal office hours. A notice board for information on Occupational Health and Safety is located just outside the station.

Library (BMS)

Located on the main floor across from the entrance to Tower B. In addition to the basic library services, it provides departmental staff access to international computer
