

Wine harvest in France: A work permit is provided to some 200 young Quebec residents for harvest work. Food and lodging are provided in most cases.

Summer employment: Municipal governments in France and Quebec exchange students for summer work. Monitors are exchanged for summer vacation camps and work camps. Food and lodging are not provided. (There may be exceptions.)

Discover France: France's Ministère de la Jeunesse et des Sports offers Quebec residents the opportunity to accompany young French nationals on a sports venture in a given region of France.

HOW LONG CAN I STAY?

Wine harvest: Permits are for eight to 10 days between September 5 and October 15.

Summer employment: Exchanges are for six to eight weeks in July and August.

Discover France: The sports venture is for 10 to 15 days during the summer.

WHO CAN APPLY?

Participants must be:

- 18 to 35 years of age;
- residents of Quebec; and
- members of the Association. (There is a \$25 membership fee.)

There is also a \$10 program registration fee.

HOW DO I APPLY?

Registration starts in mid-January to the end of March. Depending on the program selected, there may be an amount payable for a reception and one night's accommodation in Paris.

Office franco-québécois pour la jeunesse (OFQJ) *Youth Employment Mobility*

WHAT IS IT?

In 1982, the governments of France and Quebec agreed to create a youth employment exchange program. This program enables youth to fully integrate in a living and working environment by providing a training experience for them.

HOW LONG CAN I STAY?

The minimum stay is six months; the maximum 12 months.

WHO CAN APPLY?

For the Youth Employment Mobility program applicants must:

- be permanent residents of Canada;
- have lived in Quebec for at least one year;
- be 18 to 30 years of age; and
- not have taken part in the program before.

HOW DO I APPLY?

For the Youth Employment Mobility program, candidates must present a work contract signed by a French employer on a special form provided by the Ministère des Affaires Sociales, de la Santé et de la
