Statistics Canada began collecting hospitalization rates on a fiscal year basis as of 1977-78.

The statistics for the Canadian population as a whole do not include a number of medical services, e.g. special medical care facilities, community health care centres and mental health. Basically they have taken into account all services covered under provincial hospital plans, e.g. general hospitals, extended care, rehabilitation and specialty hospitals such as neurological and cardiology institutes.
