Hon. Mr. SCOTT-It is not stated. have given the amount, but not the services. I do not know about the salaries part.

Hon. Mr. LANDRY-It might be a salary, but salary as what?

Hon. Mr. SCOTT-I regret that the information is not fuller than it is; but it is like extracting teeth to get the information.
