

*Mr. Bourque*—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should consider the advisability of the establishment of a Municipal Loan Fund to provide long-term loans for major municipal improvements approved by the appropriate provincial authorities.

*Mr. Hardie*—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should consider the advisability of amending the Criminal Code to permit the raising of monies for hospitals and education, by lottery in Canada.

*Mr. Speakman*—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should give consideration to the advisability of appointing, at major centres throughout Canada, qualified lawyers to be designated as Indian advocates to whom the Indians may appeal for advice respecting their legal problems.

*Mr. Roberge*—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should consider the advisability of amending the Unemployment Insurance Act so that any benefits to which a Canadian worker would have been entitled be made available to his widow.

*Mr. Fisher*—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, consideration should be given to the advisability of setting up a select committee to study and report upon the relative efficacy of either of the two following means for checking the operation of delegated authority in order to protect the individual Canadian and to scrutinize the proliferation, logic, and fairness of such regulations: (a) the introduction in Canada of the “ombudsman” kind of scrutineer and public champion used in Scandinavian democracies; (b) the institution of a small committee, similar in size, methods, and duties to the British committee on statutory instruments.

*Mr. Hellyer*—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, the government should give consideration to the advisability of the establishment of a system of national scholarships and bursaries to be held at recognized Canadian universities and similar institutions of higher learning to be awarded on the basis of open and competitive examinations conducted in the two official languages; and a university student's loan fund to supplement the scholarships and bursaries to the end that no young Canadian with the ability to profit from higher education would be denied the opportunity because of financial obstacles.

*Mr. Allard*—On Monday next—The following proposed Resolution:—That, in the opinion of this House, consideration should be given to the advisability of referring to the Standing Committee on Banking and Commerce the recommendations of the Tariff Board on textiles, with power to call witnesses and send for documents and papers, for the purpose of examining and reporting on the problems of the textile industry, more particularly in connection with foreign imports.
