The sole head of a family, or any male The sole head of a family, or any male over eighteen years oid, may homestead a quarter-section of available Dominion land in Manicoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Landas Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made at any Dominion Lands Agency (but not Sub-Agency) on certain conditions.
