

I. THE *Dutch* took formerly from *France*, in Brocades, Velvets, Sattins, and Silk Manufactures of all Sorts, according to *De Witt's* Account, to the Value of 1,200,180 *l. Sterl. per Ann.* But now they manufacture themselves a great many Species of Silks, tho' not so fine, yet cheaper than in *France*; and take only of *French* Silks what is necessary to make up an Assortment; insomuch, that according to *Burrisb*, the Value of Silks imported annually, is diminish'd above one half; the Difference then to *France* is
