alteration shall be made, such alteration must, in like

manner, be transmitted.

II.—The by-laws of the Lodge shall be delivered to the Master on the day of his installation, when he shall solemnly pledge himself to observe and enforce them during his mastership. Every brother shall also sign them when he becomes a member of the Lodge, as a declaration of his submission to them.

Every private Lodge should have a masonic seal, to

be affixed to all documents proper to be issued.

An impression of the seal is to be sent to the grand secretary, and also, by a country Lodge, to the Provincial Grand Master; and whenever changed, another impression shall, in like manner, be transmitted.

JEWELS.

Masters of Lodges, The square

Past Masters - The square and the diagram of the 47th prop. 1st B. of Euclid, engraven on a silver plate, pendent within it.

Senior Warden - The level.

Junior Warden - The plumb.

Treasurer - - - The key.

Secretary - - - The cross pens.

Deacons - - - The dove.

Inner Guard - - Cross swords.

Tyler - - - - The sword.

The above to be in silver.—The collars to be lightblue riband, four inches broad: if silver chain be used, it must be placed over the light-blue riband.

APRONS.

Entered Apprentice—A plain white lamb skin, from 14 to 16 inches wide, 12 to 14 inches deep, square at bottom, and without ornament; white strings.
