To-day's trading plainly shows this. Had it been as large as in former times we would have had a materially higher price. Receipts everywhere very light, Northwest cars 554 against 1711 last year; clearances large. We hear of 300,000 cash wheat just been sold. As we have said repeatedly in these despatches of late, look for higher wheat. The close is strong at about the best prices of the day. Cables closed at an advance of 1½d. Corn—Is a little firmer, receipts light; so is speculation, but if we are going to have dollar wheat, notwithstanding liberal supply of corn, low prices will attract attention and May corn will sell higher. Sams appilles to oats, as the supply of oats is not, comparatively, as large as that of corn. The man who buys May oats and buys them well, that is, on weak places, won't have to face much of a loss, and some day will have a good profit.


