STRIKE ORDER IS ISSUED TO RY. SHOPMEN
40,000 Men To Stop Work Tomorrow Morning.
THIS DIVISION NOTIFIED
Men in London Shops Will Go Out Unless Demands Are Met.

MONTREAL, June 16.—A strike order was this afternoon issued by the executive committee of division No. 4 of the railway shopmen of America, and unless eleventh-hour concessions are made by the Canadian Railway War Board, 40,000 men will stop work on Wednesday morning.

A delegation representing the shopmen has been attempting to negotiate increases in wages and shorter working hours for a month, but without success. President Tallon of the shopmen's delegation here announced this afternoon that the strike order has been sent out. He also intimated that the federated trades of railway workers are included among the shopmen affected by it.

LOCAL CARMEN ARE "ALL SET" FOR STRIKE.
The Advertiser was informed that at a meeting of the local Carman's Union, which is composed almost entirely of employees of the Grand Trunk car shops, it was decided by them to strike on Wednesday morning at 10 o'clock.

Another of the staff of the Grand Trunk car shops, not a member of the union, last night said: "The best thing to do is to leave these reports alone. There has been too much publicity given to an affair which should not be agitated. I see no reason for a strike. It is true that the Dominion railway war board has not accepted the new schedule of wages, which I understand is the same as last year. The reason for this is that they are awaiting the decision of the United States railway war board on the same question. The men at work are working on a 40-hour week. However, I will not deny absolutely the possibility of a strike."

No member of the Carman's Union present at the meeting would talk regarding the motion passed last night, but the Advertiser was informed that good authority that the above decision to strike unless the demands were met was unanimously passed. Jas. Hessel, secretary of the local Trades and Labor Council, last night informed the Advertiser that he knew nothing of the decision reached. However, a decision to strike could be made without his knowledge, he stated.

Organizer Fred Young of the local Trades and Labor Council, when approached by a reporter last night regarding the strike, said: "It looks all right on the surface, but the big guns had better keep their powder dry. I let us hope for the best, prepare for the worst, and take what God sends us. Joseph Corbett, chairman of the Carman's Union grievance committee, was not in the city last night, and consequently a statement from him was not forthcoming. It is understood that he is absent on business relative to the interests of the carmen, and should a strike take place as predicted, about 2,000 employees of the two railways will be involved. Of this number 700 are at work in the local Grand Trunk carshops, and 1,300 engaged in similar duties for the Grand Trunk at Stratford. The remaining shopmen are employed on the C. P. R., at London, St. Thomas, Windsor, Port Burwell and Goderich.

Hope For Aid.
It is hoped by those in charge, that should the strike take place, it will not prove contagious to the Brotherhood of Railway Firemen and Engineers, the Brotherhood of Railway Trainmen, Order of Railway Conductors, and to the switchmen in the local railway yards.

THEDA BARA EXCELS IN BIG PHOTODRAMA AT THE PATRICIA
Celebrated Star Makes Debuture From Vampire Role.

Theda Bara in "The Two Orphans," a photodrama of Parisian life, was presented at the Patricia Theatre yesterday, and will be repeated today and Wednesday.

The picturization of this famous French novel differs radically from the stage version in power, life and color, calls for the services of an altogether exceptional cast, headed by Theda Bara and Jean Sothorn, as Henriette and Louise, the "two orphans."

The part of Henriette is a radical departure from the vampire parts with which Miss Bara's name has become associated both here and in Paris, where she was leading woman of the Theatre Antoine. Her splendid artistry, however, renders the French actress capable of giving an unusually powerful rendition of the character, and she succeeds admirably in bringing out the deep emotional side of Henriette. Jean Sothorn, one of the most winsome and beautiful of the younger American actresses, gives an appealing performance of power and pathos as Louise, the blind girl. Miss Sothorn makes her screen debut in this part.

The most massive and elaborate sets that ever lent truth and color to a photo-play are used in the production. The scene in the streets of Paris, showing the arrival of the Normandy coach with the two orphans Henriette (Theda Bara) and Louise (Jean Sothorn) alone cost \$10,000 to build and took two weeks in its construction. "The Two Orphans" embraces a midnight banquet at which wild revelry reigns. Herbert Brenon, the producer, decided that the customary stage banquet consisting of a glass dish of bananas, a ditto of apples and several empty bottles wouldn't do. He wanted the real thing. Expense was no object, so George Andrews, the maître-d'hotel of the Ritz, was summoned, and ordered to serve a regular banquet for 200 guests. The banquet cost exactly \$15 a plate, without the champagne, which was also the real thing, and disappeared before the appetite of 200 "extras" with really remarkable swiftness.
