THE MILK COMMISSION

First Session Will Be Held in Toronto on June 28.

The first meeting of the Ontario Government Milk Commission, composed of Dr. A. R. Pyne (chairman), Findlay Macdonald, W. F. Nickle and J. R. Dargavel, M.L.A.'s, for organization purposes was held at the parliament buildings last night. All the members and the secretary, W. Bert Roadhouse, were present.

After a thorough discussion of the whole question of the milk supply, it was agreed that the proposed investigation must be of the most complete character, and to that end steps will be taken to hear all the interests concerned, and the enquiry will begin with a hearing in Toronto on June 28, 29 and 30. All the dairies will be visited, and later

the enquiry will be extended to other cities of the province. The commission will also visit some of the cities of the United States where progress has been made along the line of purifying the milk supply, and in the meantime the secretary will communicate with the boards of health across the line for literature bearing upon the subject. The commission will be glad to receive any suggestions that will help them in the enquiry. These should be addressed to the secretary, Mr. Roadhouse at the parliament buildings.
