



Deepening of Welland Canal

It is urged by the Great Lakes and St. Lawrence Navigation and Improvement Association as a reason for deepening the Welland canal that steamship companies would transport the wheat crop for from two to three cents less than at present, thus saving about \$3. 600,000 to the western farmers. This argument is contained in a cir-

cular addressed by the president, H. W. Richardson, to municipalities and boards of trade asking them to aid in pressing the federal government for a grant to carry out the work.
