IN ELECTRIC BY. COBBOURG TO TORONTO... Oshawa Capitalists Will Finance Road That Will Give Lake Towns Much-Wanted Facilities.

OSHAWA, Oct. 19.—(Special).—Announcement is made today that the three towns of Oshawa, Whitby and Bowmanville are after all to secure the railway accommodation denied them by the Canadian Northern.

Construction will be financed entirely by local capitalists, and it is expected that the work will be very well advanced within a year.

It is proposed to serve the towns named above and the Village of Pickering, and to enter the city via Agincourt. A 45 minute service between Oshawa and Toronto is promised.

Application has also been made to parliament by the C. P. R. for two years' extension of their charter to build a line between Blainville and Ivanhoe, southerly thru Peterboro, Hastings and Northumberland counties.
