Miss Northwood.—This Bible woman has had a busy and on the whole a pleasant year. She reports 83 New Testaments and 24 Gospels sold. She has distributed hundreds of tracts and loaned several New Testaments. She has had many conversations and some of her visits to Roman Catholics indicate promising results. Miss Northwood has given up her work for the winter months and is at present attending Feller Institute.

Coaticook School.—For the year ending June, 1898, two teachers, Misses Stobo and Therrien conducted the school.

The attendance of Roman Catholic children was smaller this year, owing to some of them who had attended regularly heretofore, having to withdraw to study catechism elsewhere. The attendance of the school was also affected considerably by the epidemic of scarlet fever in the town, since the New Year.

The school is however well spoken of amongst Roman Catholic families.

This year the enrolment has already reached 30, half of which number are from Roman Catholic homes.

The classes taught are nearly all included in Grades 1 to 4.

Miss Stobo has sole charge of the school.

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
