Woman Hurls Boy to Safety From Roadway But is

NEW YORK, Dec. 8—Mrs. Angelina Santos was decapitated in saving her nine-year-old son, Tony, from the her nine-year-old son, Tony, from the weels of a seven-ton fruit truck. Willard Rose, driver of the truck, was locked up on a charge of homicide.

Mrs. Santos lived with her husband, a barber, and seven young children, in Brooklyn. She was crossing Third avenue at Elighteenth street with Tony's hand gripped tightly in hers when a street car approached. She stopped by the tracks a moment until it passed and then started ahead, not observing the truck directly behind the car.

Just before the truck struck her she saw it. Tony was a step behind her. She jerked him from his feet and threw him forward so that he fell to the street from the truck's wheels as she was thrown. The wheels of the truck passed over her neck and cut off her head. She died before an ambulance came.


