

## RUINED TEMPLES IN MALTA SURVIVE FROM STONE AGE

Remarkable Discoveries Made  
by Excavators of Prehistoric  
Buildings.

London, Feb. 20.—(By mail).—Some of the remarkable prehistoric buildings in Malta and Gozo have been uncovered for years, but the last and most elaborate, that at Hal-Tarxien, overlooking the plateau of Ras Hanut, was only completely excavated about three years ago.

The work of exploration and elucidation has been undertaken by Professor Zammit, C. M., the accomplished curator of the museum at Valletta, who gave a detailed account of the remains to the Society of Antiquaries of London, and his memoirs are published in "Archaeologia." The buildings first discovered were by ill-fortune entirely dug out by the local people before any trained antiquary could examine them. The antiquary that has been carefully examined by the competent hands of Professor Zammit is that of Hal-Tarxien.

The results are most remarkable, for he has been able to demonstrate, by means of the associated relics, that the structures are without question of the Stone Age, and thus of the first importance in the study of the Mediterranean culture in early times. Both by analogy with similar structures elsewhere and by inherent evidence it would seem certain that they had a religious function, and may therefore look upon them as the sacred places of cults long extinct, but of which relics doubtless still are to be

Now be determined. In any case it would seem certain that their construction extended over a not inconsiderable period of time, and that eventually they were abandoned by the Neolithic folk, and were utilized by a succeeding people of the Bronze Age as sepulchres; for at a much higher level are found numerous remains of cremation burials, the date of which is easily determined by the presence of bronze implements of an early type.

Such a use of sacred places by later peoples is a common practice in all countries, and not least in England, notably at Stonehenge, the underlying idea being doubtless that the sacred or uncanny nature of the site would help to secure the tombs from desecration.

Remarkable Friezes.

Within the chambers at Hal-Tarxien have been found friezes of carved stone, that are believed to be altars, and some of these are ornamented with carved ornament of spiral form, very graceful in design, carved in relief on a plain background. The friezes are of the spiral form found in the Aegean. In addition, there are friezes of animals, goats, bulls, and horses, and of human figures, representing, apparently, both gods and priests. The majority of these are remarkably well executed, and a peculiarity is being ascertained that there can be no doubt that it has some special meaning.

As is nearly always the case in early art, the animal and human figures are shown the same skill as is found in the purely ornamental designs. It has been surmised that the real object of the friezes was to represent the deities, which quantities were found in the temple—a belief that is borne out by the known practices found in Greece, and it is in that direction that we must look for affinities.

As at Stonehenge and elsewhere, where great stones have been erected in early times, it is of interest to find some indication of the mechanical contrivances by which they were moved. Here in Malta have been found a number of stone spheres, and it is conjectured with

some probability that they may have served as rollers to transport the large stones to the places where they were to be erected.

That burnt offerings of animals were a part of the cult is seen by the enormous stores of bones found in niches in the walls and by the fireplaces in the middle of the rooms. Dr. Zammit has done good work in producing evidence for the early date of these interesting structures, and a careful study for any scholars taking in hand the story of the Maltese people.

SPEECH BY LENINE  
"Our Retreat is Finished, We Can Resume Advance."

Moscow, April 1.—The Russian Soviet official press Pravda yesterday published additional extracts from Premier Lenin's speech early this week before a secret meeting of the All-Russian Communist Congress.

"Our retreat has finished," the Premier was quoted as saying. "We can resume taking little steps in advance."

Alluding to the Genoa conference, Premier Lenin declared:

"We have picked our best diplomats to represent us at Genoa. We are going there not as Communists, but as merchants determined to obtain the best possible conditions for our country."

Genoa with thoroughly practical and hard sense objects, namely, the enlargement of Russia's commerce and the attainment of the most favorable conditions for her development.

"The results of the diplomatic struggle at Genoa will depend partly upon the skill of our delegates." He said he believed the Genoa gathering had been decided over-ratified both in Russia and abroad. Those who heard his address remarked: "More noise has been made about Genoa than the conference really deserves."

BOY, FALLING FROM RAFT,

Since, Ont., April 1.—George Eagles pleaded guilty to the charge of burning the barn, stock and implements on the Knifern farm, three miles east of town, on Sunday, March 12, and elected to be tried by the magistrate. He was remanded for sentence.

Joseph and William Walker, father and son, were arraigned, charged with procuring Eagles to do the job. On the witness stand Eagles corroborated other witnesses as to a hard cider party at the Walker home, and his going across and touching off the barn with the third match used. He did not know Knifern and swore that Walker, senior, offered him \$50 for the job. His evidence was not corroborated. The Walkers, electing to go before a jury, were sent up for trial.

A GRAVE OMISSION.

Another 1,200,000 men have joined the ranks of the unemployed in Great Britain, through strikes and lockouts in the shipbuilding and engineering trades. Nobody has yet blamed Britain's industrial troubles on prohibition.

NET LOSS ON C. G. M. M. SHIPS.

Ottawa, April 1.—The net loss on the operation of the ships of the Canadian Government Merchant Marine during 1921 was \$2,210,724.55, exclusive of depreciation and interest due the government. Interest owing to the government up to and including December 31, 1921, was \$1,741,984.27, and \$3,207,833.39 for 1921. The total amount allowed for depreciation in value of the ships up to the end of 1921 was \$3,158,775.51. The total capital cost of all the ships belonging to the Government Merchant Marine was \$78,671,842.27. There were sixty-five ships in commission.

The average cost of these vessels per day while not in operation was stated to be \$203.12 for the 2,400-ton type; \$262.88 for ships of the 3,600 to 3,950-ton type; \$274.33 for the 4,400-ton type; \$294.08 for the 5,100-ton type; \$422.72 for the 8,100-ton type, and \$372.87 for the 10,500-ton type. ## FUTURE OF INDIA IS WITHIN EMPIRE

Lord Reading Spoke at a  
Banquet in His Honor at  
Alwar.

Delhi, India, April 1.—Speaking at a banquet in honor of Lord Reading, the viceroy, at Alwar, the Maharajah of Alwar said the princes of India sometimes received gratuitous official advice from quarters not directly concerned in their affairs, "but we try to look beyond these and march forward determinedly."

"United India," he said, "will again achieve in the future the great position she held in ages past."

The Maharajah said the Prince of Wales came to India as a British prince, but that he would return as a royal prince of India. Alluding to the Chamber of Princes, he said the united states of India, in which every state was working out its own destiny in accordance with its environment, and in which every state would continue its course for higher imperial purposes.

The Maharajah eulogized the work of Raja S. Montagu, former secretary of state for India, and said the Indian states owed much to him for their reforms.

In reply, Lord Reading said: "I'm sure India is India within the British Empire. I see India in the future counting as she should in the councils of the world. I do not despair of India's empire. I look forward to it with hope and confidence, but we must not be too hasty. True wisdom lies in calm, considered judgment, not in hurried emotion or passion. I am confident that for the peoples and princes of India there lies a future of great hope."

ONLY FOUR C. N. R.  
PASSENGERS KILLED

Ottawa, March 31.—Of more than 51,000 passengers carried on Canadian railroads during the year ending Dec. 31, 1921, only four were killed and 240 injured according to statistics compiled in the annual report of the board of railway commissioners for Canada tabled in the house this afternoon. The total number of passengers carried was 51,000,000.

## WAR OF REVENGE IS POSSIBILITY

American Delegate to Paris  
Peace Conference Makes a  
Statement—Not for Many  
Years.

London, Ont., April 1.—The members of the Chamber of Commerce and the Canadian Club were addressed at the noon luncheon on Wednesday by Prof. J. T. Shotwell of Columbia University, New York, and a native of Strathroy, Ont. Prof. Shotwell, who was a member of the American delegation at the Peace Conference in Paris, said that there is a possibility that the Germans may yet attempt a war of revenge, but it has been established that they have no large secret stores of arms or munitions, so that they would be for many years to rather poor circumstances to conduct such a campaign.

Deserted Seven Wives—Was One Time King of Spain—Remarkable Career of Crime.

Paris — Paris banking firms, hotel-keepers, jewelers and all corporations having financial dealings drew a breath of satisfaction when a notice issued by Paris police headquarters, announced that Sanchez Donato, alias Harrison, alias Edson, alias Smith, and a dozen other aliases, had been arrested at Barcelona charged with almost every offence mentioned in the civil law book.

Married seven times, he deserted all seven wives, impersonated in turn the King of Spain, a victorious British general, a witty French novelist, and an adroit and lastly is said to have obtained by fraud more than 4,000,000 francs within the past six months.

The Barcelona police gave his real name as Antonio Buzo, born at Capellades, Spain, in 1880. But they are not positive that this is his real name.

It is asserted that on one occasion, while flying from London to Paris, he found that he might need a few thousand pounds more than were actually indicated on his forged letter of credit, and promptly turned the figures 27,000 into 218,000, which the cashier paid without hesitation.

In 1914 he set out to see the world, and false letters of credit, supplemented by powerful motor cars, aeroplanes de luxe, ocean steamers and special trains, enabled him to cover the globe in a remarkably short space of time.

Almost every town he visited cost some banking firm or other a tidy sum of money. Marseilles gave him 40,000 francs, Buenos Ayres, Montevideo and Santiago de Chile 220,000 apiece.

At Geneva he banked American dollars. A 25-dollar cheque drawn at Geneva was cashed, says the charge sheet, by an agency at Marseilles for \$25,000 dollars.

On returning to Barcelona under the name of Antonio Ramon, this super-Arsene Lupin secured a letter of credit for 22,000 sterling and with this he defrauded the Commercial Bank of Rome and a bank in Milan of 220,000, the cashiers having not the slightest suspicion as to the bona fides of his letters of credit.

Ramon arrived in Paris, where he was paid a large sum of money by a bank. He returned to Barcelona under the name of Ramon de la Cabana. There he presented another letter of credit and obtained in various cities 220,000 sterling. Passing through Zurich he collected 100,000 francs.
