It seemed to him that the council should agree on the principle of having a commission first. Commissioner Wigmore pointed out that this matter was covered in the section. There was some doubt regarding the rescinding of a resolution similar to this passed last May but the Common Clerk declared that it had been rescinded and the section then carried unanimously.

Prolonged discussion occurred over Section Two, relating to the appointment of the commission. Commissioner Wigmore moved that the personnel of the commission be increased to seven. This carried, Commissioner Thornton declaring for a commission of but three. Commissioner Frink moved that the term of years be reduced from three years, as proposed by the Mayor, to two years, and, in its amended state, the second section carried. It reads as follows:

That the number of members of the said Commission be seven, with the Mayor as an additional member ex officio, that the term of office for each of the seven member bot doffice until re-appointment.


Commissioner Thornton submitted another resolution that for their services on this commission, none of the members will receive any salary or emolument arising out of their connection with the commission. This carried.


