ASSESSMENT IN LANCASTER UP

Levy on Ratepayers \$23,000 Higher Than Last Year

Total is \$148,149 — Number Taxed Shows Slight Increase for Year.

The assessment book of the Parish of Lancaster was filed this morning with the county secretary by the chairman of the Board of Assessors for the parish.

The number of ratepayers in Beaufield and Fairville shows a slight increase over last year, but the number in Lorneville and that part of the parish from the Protestant Orphan's Home to the Kings county line shows a decrease.

Total is \$148,149. The total levy this year is \$22,927.91, and the arrears carried over from last year \$55,622.07, making a total of \$148,149.98 which the taxpayers owe to the parish.

The number of ratepayers this year in Beaufield and Fairville is \$2,079, compared with 2,078 last year. In that part of the parish from the Protestant Orphan's Home to the Kings county line the number is 411, and last year it was 424.
