A chat with the expert in heraldry elicited one or two interesting facts. The grant of arms to the Queen was made because Her Majesty had no arms. Her own flaz of course, who has a coat of arms is at liberty to fly a flaz bearing the device.

A rule regarding the arms of royal ty is interesting and is not known by the general public. The arms of members of the royal family do not descend as the arms of their subjects do. A special grant to each member from the King himself is required. The grant in each case is of Hig Majesty's own arms, with the proper marks of distinction.

Though the King's children do not inherit their arms, the children of his subjects, that is, the male descendants, have a right to use the arms of their parents—fif the family have a right to the arms at all.

Royal children are granted arms by the King, as soon as they are old canough to need and use them. Prince, Edward of Wales has no arms yet, but there must be thousands of humbler children who have a right to a coat of arms.
