

The Figaro's installment today consists of two reports to Cardinal Merry dol Val, the Papal secretary of state, dated July and August, 1906. The first shows the position taken by M. Emillo Cliver, who consistently insisted that the Pope should decline to accept the law of association, an opinion which was shared by the Marquis de Beauregard. In the second report, Mgr. Montagniny described the enthusiasm that the Encyclical Gravissimo aroused among the Catholics, and reported the great satisfaction at the German embassy therewith.

The documents published by the Matin refer principally to the close relations between M. Piou and the Vatican as shown by the fact that the former submitted all his political acts for the approval of the Pope. Another report published by the Matin deals with the formation of a Catholic syndicate with a capital of \$200,000 provided by the Liberal League, which bought the Presse. The Matin publishes a confidential letter in which Mgr. Montagniny informs Cardinal Merry del Val he thinks he can obtain certain documents that gravely compromise members of the ministry, especially M. NEW YORK, 'April 4—With today the Thaw case enters upon its final stegs. The commission in lunacy appointed by Justice Fitzgerald to inquire into the present mental condition of the young man who shot Stanford White, has completed its work and will report this morning to the court. If the commission finds that Thaw is competent to realize the character of the proceedings against him and capable of consulting his lawyers the trial will go on.
