Students, who come on Scholarships, must bring their documents with them, in order that the tuition given may be endorsed on them. Students for the ministry who have passed the entrance examination to the Junior Class in Theology, and have been accepted by the Examining Committee, receive tuition free. An Education Society has been formed to help those students for the ministry who may require aid.

Tuition-fees must be paid per half-term in advance; and board-bills on the Wednesday before the first Thursday in every month in advance. Male students, who prefer it, may obtain board in such private families as are approved of by the Faculty; but female students, whose parents do not reside in Woodstock, are required to board in the Institution. All the boarders in the Institution will need to furnish themselves with bed-clothes, pillows, towels, and slippers; and also fuel, provided they use a stove in their rooms. They are also expected to get their washing done in the Institution.
