CANADIAN SHIPBUILDERS.

Canadian shipbuilders intend to bring before the Dominion government what they claim is a discrimination against Canadian-built ships in the existing customs tariff. Canadian built ships have to pay duty on the plates, machinery and other parts used in their construction, and builders claim that British built ships, being allowed to trade in Canadian waters free of customs duty on the material used in their construction is equivalent to discrimination in their favor. The government, it is said, will be asked to either grant a bonus to Canadian-built shipping or impose a duty on ships built on other than Canadian waters.

BIG APPLE SHIPMENT.

Saturday's Halifax Herald says: "The exportation of nearly 25,000 barrels of apples today by the Puruss liners Kanawha and Michigan will probably be the largest number shipped by the boards both in quantity taken in twenty-four hours and size of cargo per steamer. First to sail were the Kanawha, which pulled out for London shortly after midnight with over 10,000 barrels, this number being a part of the present season's crop of 6,000 in excess of the previous best shipment. The steamer Michigan arrived last evening on special schedule from Boston for a part freight of the Annapolis Valley fruit to be landed at Liverpool. She will get
