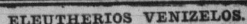

**SIR ROBERT  
TO CONTINUE  
AS PREMIER**

Mr. George A. Foster followed Sir Robert, emphasizing the warm friendship and co-operation there had been between Sir Robert and himself, his appreciation of the immensity of the task which confronted the Dominion since the outbreak of hostilities and the untiring patience and devotion that had held him to the performance of his duties and the knowledge he had acquired of the conditions and requirements not only in Canada but overseas as well. 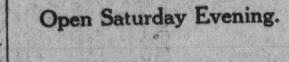
