Manchester Liner en Route.
The S.S. Manchester Port sailed

Sails Tomorrow.

En Route With Cuban Sugar.
The S.S. Lakeland Maunring sailed
from Cuba recently with a cargo of
raw sugar for the refineries here.

Large Lumber Cargo.
The S.S. Marchand (Br) which
sailed from East Boston Tuesday for
Liverpool carried a very large general
cargo. Among the articles were
70,000 bushels of barley, 3,500 tons of
provisions, 1,800 tons of steel, 100
bales of cotton, 50 tons lumber, 325
tons leather and 550 tons milk.

New American Salutations.
Revised rules governing the return
of salutes by foreign warships enter-
ing American harbors have been is-
sued by the Government, with warn-
ing to fort commanders that failure
to return such salutes is regarded as
lack of friendship, justifying explana-
tion. The new orders which failure
saluting batteries shall be deemed as
soon as a foreign warship heads into
a harbor, between 8 a. m. and sunset,
and a salute to the flag be returned
immediately. If a warship enters
after sunset the fort commanders are
to expect the salute at 8 a. m. the next
morning and to return it.
