Business Dull At Port of Quebec

At no time in the history of Quebec's shipping, says a despatch from Quebec, was business so dull as it is now.

Sixteen vessels are tied up in the Louise docks, something that has never been known before in the history of the port.

The curtailment of the C. P. R.'s passenger steamship service from four to two steamers, and the extraordinary slump in the export lumber trade is very much felt, especially by the laboring class and the local merchants.

Even the coasting trade has fallen off in comparison with former years, which is evidenced by the non-employment of the steamers Labrador, Champlain and Lady Evelyn and the few schooners engaged in this trade in comparison with past years.

At present Quebec has little or no shipping, and the prospects for the entire season, say the local, are very discouraging.

Among the boats lying idle in the Louise docks are five wooden steamships, but during the war at a cost of \$300,000 each, which are now for sale and can be had, it is stated, at the price of \$20 per ton.

British Capture Brazilian Trade

Americans Say They Are Outstripping United States' Merchants in This Market.

New York, May 19.—British trade interests are driving United States manufacturers out of Brazilian markets, according to Augusto Cochrane de Azevedo, Brazilian ambassador to the United States, who addressed the world trade conference of the National Association of Manufacturers here today.

During the war, he said, United States manufacturers had a free field, but since the restoration of peace, they have had to meet the competition of former rivals, who, he said, are undoubtedly driving them out.

Great Britain, France and Belgium put their money into foreign enterprises, and obtain not only a return on the investment, but secure large orders for material and supplies of all kinds, thus developing their foreign trade.

The speaker said, after pointing out that the investments of companies of the United States in Brazilian enterprises greatly exceeds the capital invested by United States business interests.
