Pierre Piche appeared before me at Wetaskiwin and claimed scrip.

The claimant in appearance struck me as being a typical Indian. He stated that he lived with his grandmother on the Bear Hills Reserve; that he was refused treaty; that he was married; that his wife received treaty money; that his mother got scrip; that his father died before scrip was issued.

I have disallowed the claim on the ground that he should be classed as an Indian and be admitted to the band of which his wife is a member. Please advise me that the necessary action to this end has been taken, so that I can inform the claimant accordingly when writing him as to the disallowance of his application for scrip.
