

Sept. 24 Present at 26 Broadway in conference with Mr. Greene and Mr. Murphy, during this day and two days following, respecting form of announcement of association with Foundation in industrial relations investigation - Was invited to be present at a conference in Mr. Rockefeller's office at which Mr. Welborn spoke of interview he had had with President of the United States. Did not regard myself as having been invited to participate in conference, but rather to be given opportunity of listening to what was being said that I might gain a further insight into Colorado situation. The evening of this day spent at Mr. Rockefeller, Jr.'s house in company with Mr. Welborn and Mr. Lee. Talked with Mr. Welborn on way out and with Mr. Lee on way back. Conversation with Mr. Welborn mostly about situation in Colorado and my own experiences in dealing with labor troubles. My talk with Mr. Lee on way back was more particularly with reference to what I was planning in regard to work for the Foundation.

Sept. 25 (Or Saturday the 26th, cannot remember which) Met Mr. Neill for a minute at offices of Foundation. He had been at a conference of which I knew nothing. Our conversation together was little more than an exchange of friendly greeting.

At lunch with Mr. Welborn on Friday the 25th (or Saturday the 26th, cannot remember which) recall his asking my opinion on adopting a scheme of co-operation in connection with Company's stores. Mr. Murphy, I think, also present. I recall speaking of the Harvard Co-operative as a personal experience with stores of the kind and strongly approving of the idea of adopting this method as a means of removing any grounds of suspicion
