

Mr. Josef Dreveny accompanied by his wife and five children arrived in Canada on April 17th, 1927, from Bejanowice Dolne, Moravia, Czecho-Slovakia. The Land Settlement Department of the Canadian National Railways directed this family to the Margo district in Saskatchewan, where Mr. Dreveny purchased a 160 acre farm (NaW. \$\frac{1}{4}\$ 3-34-10 West 2nd) at a price of \$3700. With a cash payment of \$800.

During the past season Mr. Dreveny had in crop 25 acres of wheat and 20 acres of oats, they also had a good truck garden, which yielded well of all kinds of vegetables sufficient for winter use. They also purchased 4 horses, 1 cow, 1 calf, 4 pigs, 80 chickens and the necessary equioment - mower, rake, disc, harrow, plow and wagon. They have also built a hen house and granary since coming on the place. Mr. & Mrs. Dreveny express themselves as well satisfied with Canada.
