He will stay here whether he is elected or defeated. He will not go away and come back when another election takes place. He knows your problems and knows your troubles, and can I feel sure, if elected, look after your wants.

I see in the Kingston Whig-Standard tonight where n the Honourable Dr. Heenan spends a lot of his time making statements about myself. I want to say that it is not me that is on trial. If a Cabinet Minister from the Hepburn Government cannot do better than attack me, he has little to do. As far as I am concerned, I do not propose to su mit myself to the policies of the Liberal parties.
