- H. Black to Neilson. Criticizing the amendments made in the Assembly to the Judicature Act. Québec, 5th June, 1846.
- H. Black to Neilson. (Private). On the same subject. Québec, 6th June, 1846.
- Hon. D. Daly to Neilson. Informing him that a warrant has been ordered to pay him £500 for the Agricultural Society of the County of Québec, under the provisions of the Act 8 Victoria c. 53. Secretary's Office, Montreal, 28th July, 1846.
- J. Holmes to Neilson. Respecting the course of studies in his school; and its attendance. Québec, 3rd August, 1846.
- Hon. D. Daly to Neilson. Stating that, as the whole of the public buildings in Québec with a certain reservation was placed at the disposal of the corporation of Québec, the Mechanics Institute became liable to the corporation for rent, if demanded. Secretary's Office, Montreal, 21st August, 1846.
- Thaddeus Osgood to Neilson. Enclosing for publication in the *Québec Gazette*, a letter regarding his work among the poor and unfortunate. Québec, 14th October, 1846.
- E. L. Montizambert to Neilson. Offering his services in a professional capacity. Montreal, 27th October, 1846.
- David Thompson to Neilson. Enclosing a prospectus of a book he proposed to write on his travels in North America. He had wandered for three years over the plains between the Missouri and the Saskatchewan rivers, and was the only person who had any knowledge of the territory. Montreal, 16th November, 1846.
- J. Neilson to John Bouner (Draft). Acknowledging the receipt of a book by a son of the latter entitled "Considérations générales sur les effets des Révolutions de France et d'Angleterre," and making some comments on it. Québec, 21st November, 1846.
- Rev. C. Chiniquy to Neilson. Presenting him with a copy of his *Manuel de Tempérance*. Longueuil, 31st December, 1846.
- James McKay to Wm. McMaster. The Québec Mechanics Institute are to offer an address of congratulation to Lord Elgin on his assuming the government and invite him to become a patron; and express their regret at the death of Lord Metcalfe, their late patron. Neilson as president of the society is requested to prepare the address. Québec, 4th January, 1847.
- E. L. Montizambert to Neilson. Offering to translate Mr. Chiniquy's "Manuel de Tempérance". Montreal, 16th January, 1847.
- G. R. Young to Neilson. Stating that he is writing a series of letters to the Nova Scotian on the railway project, and purposes gathering them into a pamphlet for distribution. He promises to assist with the telegraph scheme, if conditions are favourable. House of Assembly, 27th January, 1847.
- Rev. C. Chiniquy to Neilson. Thanking him for his reception of his "Manuel de Tempérance"; and for his suggestion that the work should be translated into English. The bishop of Montreal wished that this might be done, for the use of the Irish population of the country. Longueuil, 30th January, 1847.
