THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD

REGULATIONS

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lands in Manitoba or the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 26, which has not been home-scaded, or reserved to provide wood lots for settlers, or fgr other purposes, may be homesteaded upon by any person who is the sole head of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of one-marter section of 160 acres, more or less.

ENTRY

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District

in which the land to be taken is a 'tuate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the District in which the land is situate, receive authority for some one to make entry for him. A fee

of \$10 is charged for a homestead HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted at entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto, to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:—

(I) At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father for mother, if the father is deceased or any persen who is eligible to make a homestead entry unon the provisions stead entry unon the provisions stead entry unon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for lay such person as homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a settler has obtained a petent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the manner presented by this Act, and has chained entry for a second homestead, or a credition of the second homestead. If the second homestead is in reddence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead. If the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first homestead.

owned by him in the vicinity of
his household, the requirements

said land.

The term "vicinity" used above
is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or connecting
township.

A settler who avails himself of
the provisions of Clauses (2) (3) or
(4) must cultivate 30 acres of his
homestead, or substitute 20 head of
stock, with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides &
acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader hav is liable to
have his entry caucelled, and the
hand may be again thrown open for
entry.
