And the said Resolutions are as followeth :

RESOLVED, that there is due to fundry persons, Three hundred and thirty pounds five shillings and eleven pence, agreeable to the general Abstract signed *Samuel Phillips*, 28th May, 1799.

RESOLVED, that there is due to *Louis Dubord*, Messenger of the Legislative Council from the 18th March to the 5th June 1799, 80 days at 3s per diem, making Twelve pounds.

RESOLVED, that there is due to *Francis Romain*, as Door Keeper to the Legislative Council from 18th March to 5th June 1799, 80 days at 2s6 per diem, is Ten pounds

RESOLVED, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that it will be expedient to advance the Clerk of the House of Assembly the sum of Twenty pounds currency to purchase firewood at a proper season, for the next session of the House, and that he do account for the same.

RESOLVED, that it is the opinion of this Committee, that there be, in future, allowed to each of the Door keepers of the Assembly Three shillings per diem for their services, instead of Two shillings and six-pence, at present established.

On motion of Mr. *Grant*, seconded by Mr. *Dumas*,

RESOLVED, that this House doth concur with the several Resolutions reported by the Committee.

On motion of Mr. *Planté*, seconded by Mr. *Berthelot*,

RESOLVED, that an humble Address be presented to His Excellency the Governor General, to request His Excellency that he will be pleased to issue his warrant in favor of *Samuel Phillips*, Esquire, Clerk of this House, for the sum of two hundred and fifty pounds, five shillings and eleven pence currency, to which the printing of Bills and the Journals of this House, Messengers and Servant's wages, Stationary, Fire-wood and other contingent expences incurred by the House, amount, after deducting the sum of one hundred pounds currency already paid
