A petition of Francis Blackburn was presented to the House and read—setting forth: That he is a Clothier by trade and capable of carrying on that business in all it's various branches—that the petitioner's circumstances not being adequate to erect a mill for that purpose, he preserved a petition to this House at the last session which was not considered on account of Solomon Dingee's having made preparations for erecting a Fulling Mill; but as the said Solomon Dingee had never undertaken any part thereof, the petitioner proceeded in building and completing a Fulling Mill near Jemseg, in Queen's county—and praying that this House will grant him a bounty for the same.

Ordered, That the faid petition lie on the table.
